Our Governance

The Vine Schools Trust Directors are a core group of people with a proven track record of school improvement and experience that is relevant to making the Trust a success. They are responsible for our strategic direction, they are accountable for the academies and they are required to report to the Secretary of State. The Vine Board has overall responsibility and ultimate decision-making authority for all the work of the Trust.

Our Local School Boards are a vital part of our framework, as they are the key strategic decision makers in our academies. They are responsible for ensuring that the school maintains a high standard of performance and that there is access to the necessary resources to ensure the children are receiving an excellent education. Each Board oversees the day-to-day running of our schools and the Scheme of Delegation is used to implement an effective decision-making process. If a school is not performing to a standard that we expect, delegated responsibilities may be withdrawn as an emergency measure until the school reaches a state of stability.

Our **Community Boards** are groups that have responsibilities delegated to them from the directors. They work closely with our Local School Boards, but with a focus on the ethos of our schools, fostering meaningful links with our communities and establishing a relationship with local churches.
